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# Methodology

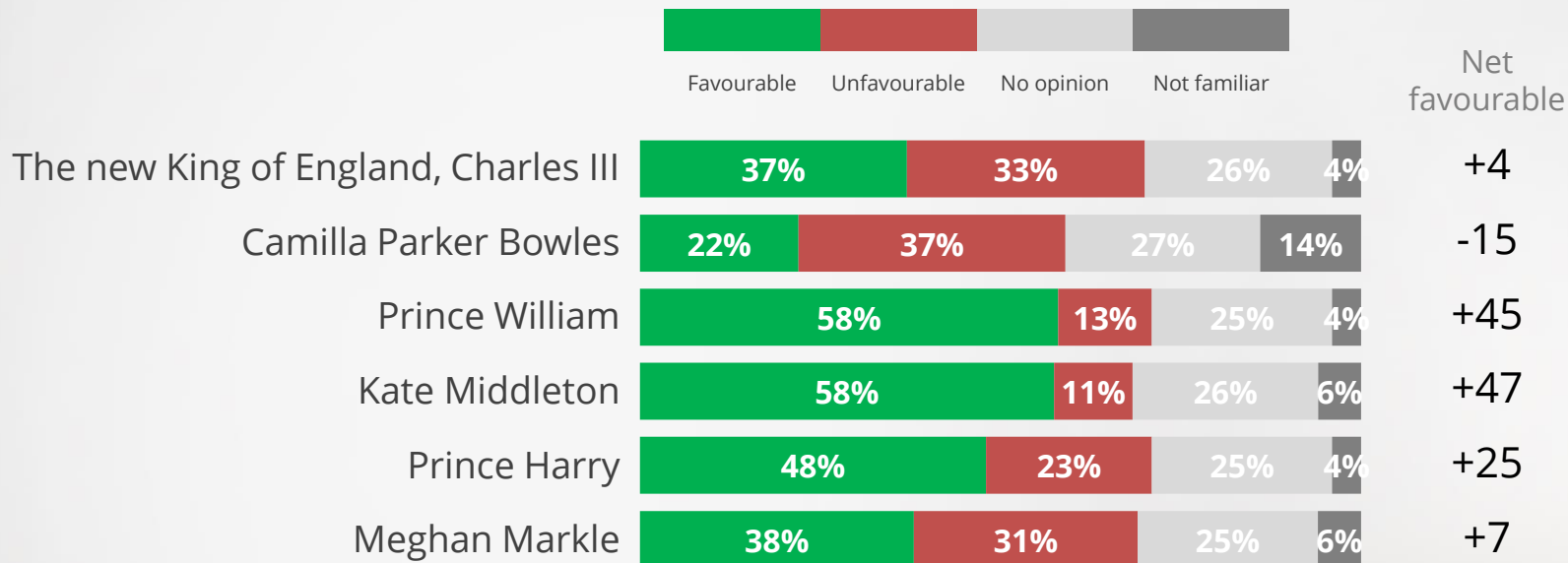
- **Field Window: September 9 to 13, 2022**
- **Sampling:** Online survey of randomly-selected sample of **1,325 adult (18+) Canadians**
- **Reliability:** As a guideline\*, a probability sample of this size carries a margin of error of **± 2.7%**, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error is larger for sub-segments.
- **Weighting:** Data has been weighted using the most current gender, age, & region Census data, to ensure the sample reflects the actual population of adult Canadians.

# Key Findings

- Canadians have mixed views on King Charles III, with a similar number favourable (37%) and unfavourable (33%) towards him. They are considerably more favourable towards his sons.
- There is no consensus on Canada's future as a constitutional monarchy, though more Canadians oppose (44%) than support (35%) staying as one.
  - The majority of Quebecers and young Canadians do not want Canada to continue as a constitutional monarchy.
- Only one-in-four (24%) think Canada should put the face of King Charles III on its money, with the majority (56%) opposed to this.

# Mixed views on King Charles III, though Canadians largely favourable towards William and Harry

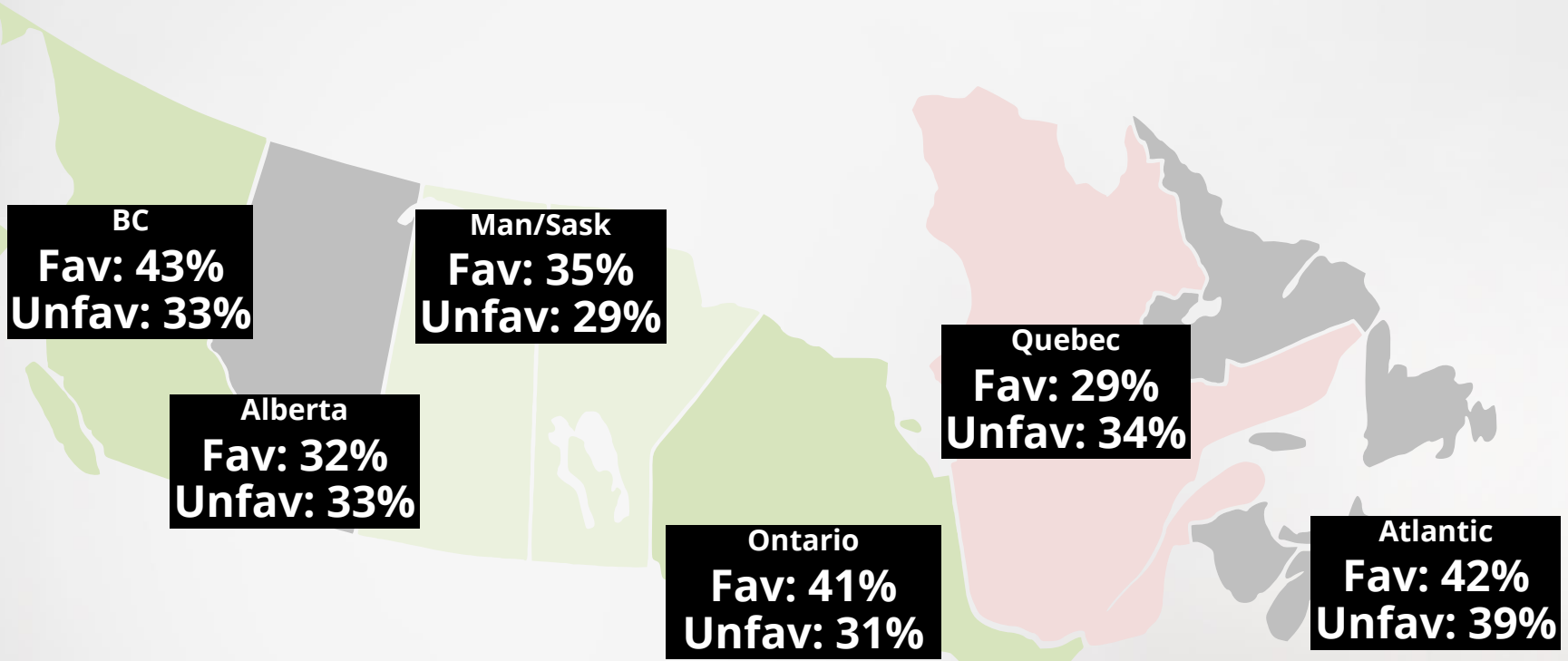

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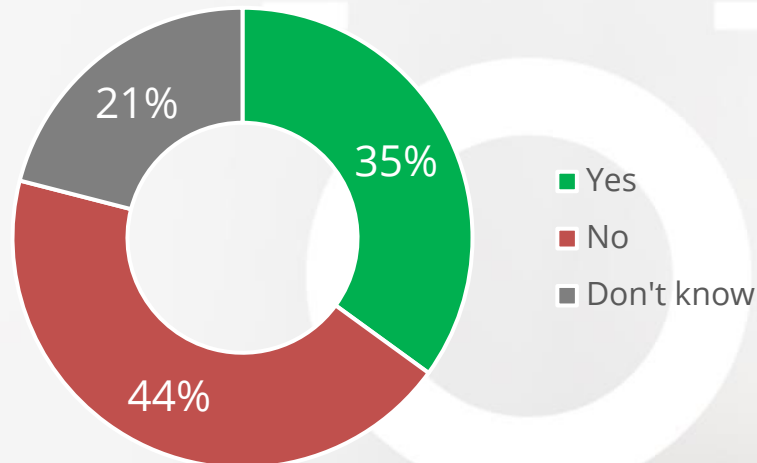
# Impressions of King Charles III, by Region

## No consensus on Canada's future as a constitutional monarchy, though more oppose than support staying one

Views on Canada's future as a constitutional monarchy are the same among immigrants (yes: 35% / no: 44%) and those born here (yes: 36% / no 44%).



Do you think Canada should remain a constitutional monarchy, with the King of England as its head of state?

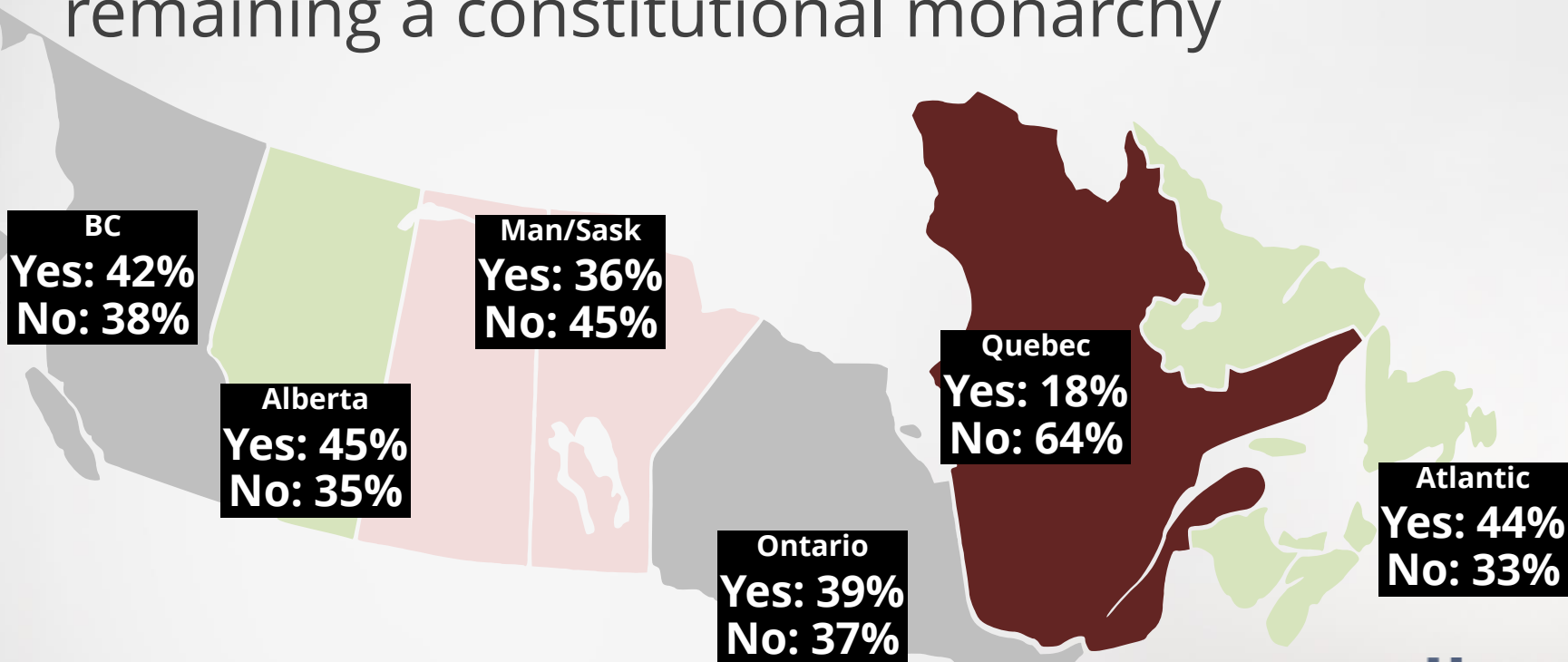

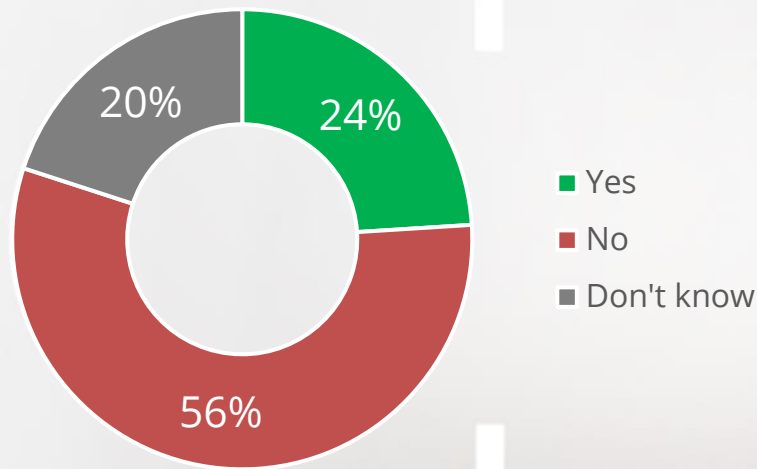
