

Political Landscape An update on the horse race

JULY 2023



Methodology

- Field Window: June 7 to June 23, 2023
- Sample size: 7,001 adult (18+) Canadians
- Reliability (*): Online surveys cannot be assigned a margin of error. This survey of 7,001 Canadians includes 5,423 <u>decided</u> voters. As a guideline, a probability sample of n = 5,423 carries a margin of error of ± 1.3%, 19 times out of 20.
- Weighting: Data has been weighted using the most current education, gender, age, and region Census data, to ensure the sample reflects the actual population of adult Canadians.



The State of the Horse Race


- Support levels are similar to 2021 election results. **The Conservatives** lead the Liberals 32% to 30%, with the NDP at 21%.
 - Support levels have been relatively stable since November, with the Liberals and Conservatives within 3 points of each other every month over this period.
- Though Liberal support is close to 2021 levels, it is sagging more in key electoral markets for them such as Montreal, the Greater Toronto Area, and the BC Lower Mainland.
- The Liberals and Conservatives both have an older skew in their support levels, with the NDP leading among young voters. Liberal support is similar among men and women, with the Conservatives significantly stronger among men and the NDP much stronger among women.
 - Young people do not present as a monolith. While the NDP lead among women under 35, they trail both the Conservatives and Liberals among young men. NDP support is much higher among students, and is lower among young people who have kids and own homes.

Conservatives lead Liberals by 2 points nationally







Support levels stable





Liberals lead in Ontario and Atlantic Canada, but Conservatives in front out west







NDP support up from 2021 results in all provinces, except for British Columbia






Toronto / 905 ("905" are the communities around Toronto)

Liberals down in Winnipeg and the Lower Mainland





Conservatives strongest amongst men, Liberals lead among older women, NDP lead among younger women

Liberal support higher among university-educated

Conservative support *increases* with income, NDP support *decreases* with income

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


Liberal support among racialized voters, 9 points higher than their support among other voters
