
Yukon Election Snapshot

October 2025

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Methodology

Field Window October 22 to 26, 2025

Sampling Live-interviewer telephone survey, with calls made to both landlines and cell phones. A random sample of eligible voters in the Yukon were polled.

Reliability In total, **502 interviews were collected**. Survey results are accurate to $\pm 4.4\%$, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error is larger for sub-segments.

Weighting Data has been weighted using the most current gender, age, & region Census data, to ensure the sample reflects the actual population of eligible voters in the Yukon.

Research standards Pollara Strategic Insights is a member of the Canadian Research Insights Council (CRIC), and this research was conducted in compliance with CRIC standards.

Sponsor This poll was commissioned by the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC).

- The Yukon Party leads with 52% of the decided vote, followed by the Yukon NDP at 34% and the Yukon Liberals at 11%.
- The Yukon Party leads by 17 points within Whitehorse and by 22 points in the rest of the territory.
- The Yukon Party are strongest among men and 35-to-64 year olds. The Yukon NDP are strongest among women and seniors.
- The Yukon NDP lead the Yukon Party by 12 points among Indigenous voters.
- 13% of voters are undecided, and 37% say they are open to changing their minds before election day.



Survey Findings

Decided Vote: Yukon Party leads NDP by 18 points, with Liberals a distant third

- This marks a 21-point decline in Yukon Liberal support since the 2021 territorial election, with the Yukon Party up by 13 and the Yukon NDP up by 6.

13% of voters are undecided.

Among them, 30% are open to voting Yukon NDP, 24% are open to voting Yukon Party, and 22% are open to voting Yukon Liberal.

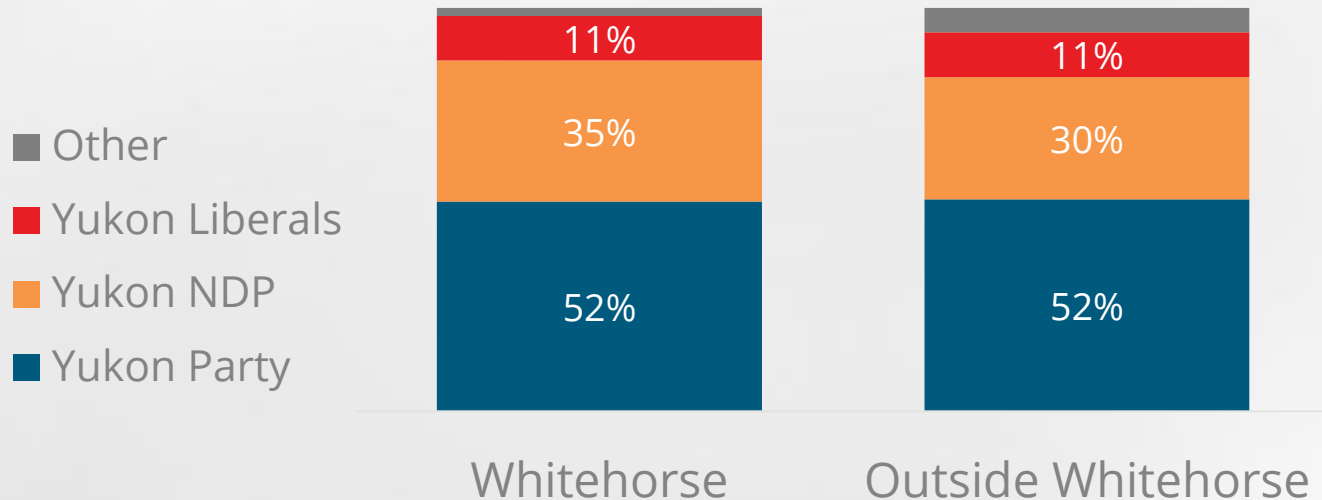


If the election were held today, who would you be most likely to vote for or lean towards?

Decided Vote – by Region: Yukon Party leads in both Whitehorse and the rest of the territory

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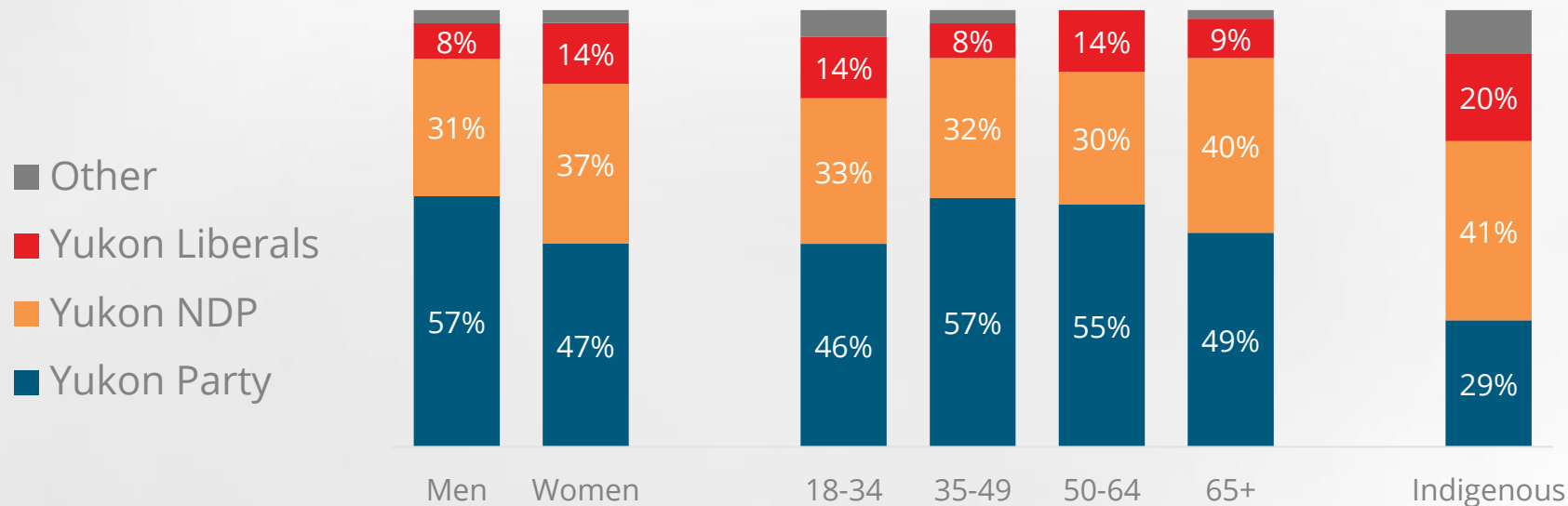
- The undecided rate is higher outside Whitehorse (18%) than inside Whitehorse (11%).

Vote Motivation: Yukon Party supporters are most motivated to turn out, with majority of Yukon Liberal supporters just “going through the motions”

Last Election Vote Transfer: Yukon Liberals only holding one-fifth of their 2021 vote

Federal Vote Transfer: Federal Liberal vote splintered, with the Yukon NDP picking up the largest share of it

How to read chart: 20% of Carney voters would vote for the Yukon Liberals, 26% for the Yukon Party, 36% for the Yukon NDP, and 18% are undecided, leaning elsewhere, or don't plan to vote.

Potential Vote Shifts: Yukon Liberals most likely to lose support over the final days of the campaign

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- The **Yukon Party** has 10 points of growth potential (5 points from Yukon NDP, 3 from undecideds, 2 from Yukon Liberals)
- The **Yukon NDP** has 12 points of growth potential (6 points from Yukon Party, 4 from undecideds, 2 from Yukon Liberals)
- The **Yukon Liberals** have 11 points of growth potential (5 points from Yukon Party, 4 from Yukon NDP, 3 from undecideds)
